NAME TAGS NOW FREE

U3A hard plastic name tags which were previously \$12 are now free on request.

ENROL NOW FOR 2026

Enrolments do not carry on from one year to the next.* To ensure a place, submit enrolment slip and payment as soon as possible. Enrolments are processed on a first come first served basis. While some groups struggle for numbers, others fill quickly.

For those who like to do things in person, your best opportunity to submit enrolment forms and money before the early bird rate expired was our Registration Day which was **FRIDAY 5 DECEMBER.**

The only way to get cash payments in from now on will be at the counter of our bank, see below. Enrolment forms (but no cash) can go into the mail box on the U3A door in the Clare Town Hall foyer.

New members should fill out a New Members Enrolment Form available from our website or anyone on the committee.

Enrolment is not complete until both money and your course choices are received. Please list all your selected subjects ('same as last year' isn't enough).

(*If you paid \$35 to enrol in Term 4, that payment will cover you for 2026 but still submit paperwork.)

EARLY BIRDS SAVE \$10

The deadline for early bird payments changed to last day of previous year back in 2024. We think it worked well as everyone was encouraged to get their entries in while U3A activities were still running.

The annual subscription is \$35 with \$10 discount for payment by 31 December. Don't risk forgetting. Enrol and pay now for just \$25.

When the early bird rate expires, fees will be the full \$35 from 1 January 2026.
