STATEWIDE ONLINE

Remember our State body, U3A South Australia is still facilitating the offering of online courses under the name of Statewide. These courses and presentations originate from individual U3As (Adelaide, Campbelltown, Mt Gambier, etc.) and any member in the State can log in on their home computer and take part for no extra cost.

At the moment the program includes: Geology, French, Italian, Philosophy, Climate Information, Novel and Memoir Writing, Positive Psychology, and of course various computer topics.

People seem reluctant to try something different as so far Statewide is attracting sparce enrolments. Unless this trial is embraced more heartedly, we will lose this option. The software to run it has to be paid for each month and after September we will be looking at the cost/benefit value of continuing to offer this to members.

WHERE WILL WE FIND ANOTHER MARIAN?

Marian Wicks has been our iPad/tablet tutor since mid 2016. During that time many of you have been helped to master your small computing devices, often with one-on-one tuition. There was no set teaching plan, just concentrating on what individuals wanted to learn.

Teaching this topic has included important work like showing members how to create MyGov and MyHealth accounts and link them to their COVID vaccination records, etc.

Marian, deeply involved in Red Cross, has always had many other commitments, but now one of those will take her away from us permanently. She and husband Steve (former U3A Geology tutor) are building a new house in the Adelaide Hills.

We thank Marian for everything she has done over the last six years. During that time the Town Hall internet mysteriously disappeared but classes persisted with Marian personally providing the internet. Teaching can be very rewarding but also quite thankless when you drive long distances, as Marian does, to find that the students hadn't let her know they couldn't attend. We thank her doubly for those days.

Even if Marian is free again later this year, in the long term we will need a replacement. I am sure she would appreciate being replaced sooner than later. There must be many people out in the community who are quite competent users of their iPads and tablets. We just need to find one or two willing to share their knowledge.

We have appealed to Council to have the secure WiFi connection restored at the Town Hall so it will be easier for the next teacher. Please contact someone on the committee if you could be that person or you know someone who might.
